
Granny and Grandad get their vaccine

The doctor or nurse injects the vaccine into their arm. Getting the vaccine is a little bit sore, but the pain doesn't last very long.




After three weeks, Granny and Grandad go back to get their second dose of the vaccine.




Two weeks after their second dose,
